St. Patrick's Day is a time to celebrate the rich and diverse heritage of Irish people throughout the world. We are celebrating this important day by dedicating our newsletter this month to St Patrick's day festivities throughout District 71.

A little bit about this Irish patron saint....St. Patrick was born in Roman Britain around the year 385 and was kidnapped by Irish raiders when he was 16. He spent six years as a slave in Ireland, where he learned the Irish language and culture. He escaped and returned to Britain, but felt called by God to go back to Ireland as a missionary.

St Patrick used the shamrock, a three-leafed plant, to explain the concept of the Holy Trinity to the pagan Irish. Traditionally, the Taoiseach (Prime Minister) of Ireland travels to the States and presents a bowl of shamrock to the US President on the 17 th March.

St Patrick's Day is a wonderful international celebration and I wish you a very happycelebration in the UK and Ireland, along with all our fellow Toastmasters across the globe.

All the pupils wore a celebration badge on that occasion. A photo of mine is attached which was the decoration when I was seven years old. It has been with me in all the different homes I had and definitely shows signs of maturity.

We, as a family have always had great pride in our Irishness. The family prayers e.g. "The Rosary" were recited in the native Irish, Gaelic language.

More than likely Mom cooked bacon and cabbage on the feast day to be topped off with dessert of the colours green, white and gold reminiscent of the National Flag. Green-the jelly, White-the cooked rice pudding and Gold-the custard.


Life was very simple then and we did not have parades at the cross roads or television to watch the Hudson River flow green.
